Important Information on Volunteering:

- The Volunteer Check-In entrance (SEE Map) is located on the north side of the festival (about mid-block – there's a big sign on the fence!). Identify yourself as a volunteer and you will be taken to the Volunteer Check-In desk to get your wristband, review your responsibilities and escorted to your volunteer assignment.
- We try to place our volunteers where they've had previous experience (at our event or another) or the request(s) you make on your application. Based on the numbers of volunteers and our needs, we may need to place you in another position. <u>The most</u> important part of this is selecting the day and shift(s) that you are available.
- You will receive <u>one</u> free admission ticket per shift worked. If you volunteer on Friday, you will get <u>one</u> free admission ticket for Saturday. Saturday volunteers work half the festival and enjoy the other half. You <u>DO NOT</u> get an extra free ticket for a guest, spouse, etc.
- The weather in June can be hot (but dry!) and you might want to bring lip balm and sunscreen. There will be both at the Volunteer check-in and rest area. You may bring in an empty refillable water container, which can be filled inside with water. We have a Volunteer rest area, where you checked in, to take a break and get some refreshments. Please make sure you are hydrated!
- We <u>do not</u> provide meals, BUT have plenty of snacks and beverages (water, Gatorade, etc.) in the Volunteer Check-In and Rest areas. Please plan accordingly. There are several top notch Food Trucks at the festival.
- <u>Drinking alcohol, while on your shift, is not allowed.</u> There is plenty of time after/before your shift to enjoy your favorite beverages. It keeps us and those around you safe. This is a family friendly environment, and we want to keep it that way!
- Many of our Volunteers have been with us for years. If you have a question or concern, please reach out to one of our staff. They have lanyards (STAFF) and can answer your question or point you in the right direction. We're a team and we support each other!
